





Parking information

There are two car parks which are accessed via Gate 11 on Botany Street, just next to the AGSM building. The smaller outdoor carpark has casual visitor parking located along the back wall and certain sections throughout the car park. This car park is located immediately before the multi-story car park – **please turn right into the car park before the multi-story carpark.**

The multi-story carpark has visitor parking on the roof level **only, as there is only limited parking please leave an extra 15-20 minutes to arrive on time.**

Visitors and non-permit holders must park in the “**2P Pay and Display**” sections. Cost of parking is \$3.00 per hour. Both car parks are a short walk to the Lowy Cancer Research Centre building. There are also short term (1 hour) parking spots along Botany and High Streets and nearby streets. **Disabled Parking** is available at both **Gate 9** and **Gate 11** entrances.

TOUR INFORMATION

Children's Cancer Institute Lab Tour Information

This tour will provide you with an opportunity to visit Children's Cancer Institute's state-of-the-art laboratories, to meet our research staff and experience their work firsthand. Please take this opportunity to ask any questions you have about our research.

Following a brief introduction to the institute and our research programs, we will take the group through our laboratories and will provide an update on our research. At the conclusion of the tour, guests will be escorted back to Level 5 for light refreshments and further discussion.

For your safety, we do have regulations for our laboratories which are outlined below in the Special Notes section. These are government requirements and are in place so that you are able to have a positive and safe experience. Of particular importance to note, is the item regarding footwear. **Please do ensure that on the day, you wear shoes that cover your entire foot, including the toe, heel and top of your foot** (i.e. sandals, ballet flats and sling-back shoes are not acceptable). Additionally, high heels are not permitted to be worn in the laboratories.

We would like to take photographs of your visit to the Institute's laboratories both for your own personal use on request, and for the Institute's editorial purposes. Please bring a disposable face mask to wear within the laboratory.

Special Notes

1. Laboratories are PC2 - this means that they are contained laboratory facilities and it is essential to ensure that nothing is removed deliberately or inadvertently from the laboratories.
2. Visitors must wear solid fully enclosed shoes.
3. If visitors have hair longer than shoulders, it must be tied back when in the laboratories.
4. No personal items to be taken into laboratories, including mobile phones - all such items to be left at reception where they will be held securely.
5. Items such as cameras and/or video equipment must be carried at all times and are not to be placed on laboratory benches or floor.
6. Laboratory gowns must be worn by visitors when in the laboratories.
7. Gloves must also be worn at all times in the laboratory areas.
8. Leaning on laboratory benches is prohibited.
9. All gowns and gloves must be discarded by visitors into the appropriate bin when leaving the laboratories.
10. Hands **MUST** be washed before leaving the laboratories.
11. In the event of an emergency, follow directions given via your tour host, fire wardens, PA announcements, emergency warning tones or fire bells. If required to evacuate the building proceed directly to the nearest Fire Exit and then to the designate assembly area.

For the safety of our visitors and to ensure the integrity of our research, it is important that visitors understand and adhere to these instructions.
